- The 2020-2021 Advisory Board met via Zoom on November 7, to review and discuss the Governance Handbook, share committee updates and accomplishments, and participate in committee workshops
- Brief overview of the voting procedures for official documents
 - o Who can vote and how we will conduct virtual polls
- School policy updates second semester plans
 - Most in a "wait and see pattern", no new expectations until end of Jan.
 - Spring break cancelled
 - Practices capped
 - Teams can get creative and utilizes all water spaces, like the diving well
 - No in person events but virtual is possible
- Organizational updates:
 - o Current club and member numbers
 - 877 members
 - 35 clubs
 - o 2020 organizational enhancements
 - Virtual meets
 - Weekly workouts
- Presentation of the CCS-USMS relationship as well as the budget
- Advisory Board brainstormed other benefits CCS can provide to help grow the number of clubs and improve retention
- The Advisory Board received an update from the Nationals liaison. Many schools are in a holding pattern for the spring semester, which makes attendance for Nationals an unknown. Backup plans will be developed with the host and the competition committee.
- The Advisory Board reviewed and discussed changes to Governance Handbook
 - The Governance Handbook changes will go into effect for the 2021-22 school year
- The Advisory Board held breakout workshop sessions within the committees and had each committee present their work and next steps
- The Advisory Board discussed sending out another school policies survey at the beginning of second semester to check in with teams.
- The Advisory Board discussed creating Zoom meetings for each Region. These would only be for clubs in that Region and the conversation would be more personal/local
